



Beginning Monday, March 14th, 2011, Nicolet High School along with School Resource Officer Kelly DeJonge will implement the “Quick 50” program at Nicolet.

“Quick 50” is a program in which students can confidentially report knowledge of alcohol, drugs, and/or weapons in school to their assistant principal, principal, school resource officer, or guidance counselor. If the tip leads to an arrest or citation, the student who provided the tip will receive up to \$50.00 in cash.

If your children have any concerns regarding alcohol, drugs, or weapons on school grounds, please urge them to speak with Officer DeJonge, an administrator, or a counselor as soon as possible. Their names will be withheld from all documents and will not appear in police department reports or records.

The Fox Point-Bayside Patch, a local online newspaper, has graciously donated \$250.00 for initial funding of the program. When the initial \$250.00 has been depleted, the Glendale Police Department will assist in funding the program. The “Quick 50” program serves as another way in which we work to provide a safe learning environment for all.
